KidSport enables Western Australian children to participate in community sport and recreation, no matter their financial circumstances. Eligible youth aged 5-18 years can apply for financial assistance to contribute towards club fees. Applicants must have a Health Care card or Pension Concession Card OR be referred by a recognised referral agent. A maximum of \$200 per child is available per calendar year.

Community Inclusion and Participation Grants Program

The program seeks to develop sustainable approaches to inclusion and participation for people with disability.

FUNDING BODY: Disability Services Commission in partnership with VisAbility Inc in support of the Count Me In vision.

AMOUNT AVAILABLE: Grants of up to \$5,000.00 and \$20,000.00 will be available to organisations, community groups and local governments with a small number of grants of up to \$50,000.00 also available for major products.

CLOSING DATE: Closing 21 November 2014 at 5.00pm - The grants will be funded in January 2015 and all programs or activities will need to have concluded by 30 June 2016.

ELIGIBLE GROUPS:

- Incorporated, not-for-profit organisations and associations based in Western Australia
- Local government authorities
- Applications for partnerships form for-notprofit organisations will not be excluded and will be assessed on their merit
- Unincorporated not-for-profit associations and groups based in Western Australia will be eligible where auspiced by an incorporated association or local government (auspicing quidelines apply)

Furniture and Equipment Grant

FUNDING BODY: Lotterywest

AMOUNT AVAILABLE: Not stated

CLOSING DATE: Applications can be made at any time

ELIGIBLE GROUPS: These grants are available to not-for-profit organisations and local government authorities.

- The grant supports the purchase of furniture and equipment that meet your organisation's needs. By way of example, grants can be for office items, telephone and filing systems, resource materials, whitegoods, toys, musical instruments and workshop tools.
- Lotterywest look for how the equipment will benefit people i.e. suitability of the equipment for its purpose and your organisation's ability to maintain the equipment.
- Applicants will need to submit a completed Lotterywest Grant Application Form, your groups latest Annual Report (if you have one), or AGM minutes if you don't, most recent audited financial statements, a copy of your Constitution and two written quotes for items over \$3,000; a written estimate, advertised price, or one written quote for items under \$3,000 (low value, miscellaneous items can be grouped together to \$1,000)
- Previous project examples include recreational equipment, such as indoor bowls, for people in aged care centres, craft equipment for hobby groups such as needle craft and pottery, meeting room furniture for a community centre, diagnostic equipment for community-based preventative health services, outdoor equipment for programs to support the personal development of young people, machinery to repair and recycle toys for disadvantaged children in remote communities, emergency equipment for organisations helping neglected animals, musical equipment for community bands performing at charity events

This enabled members to be accountable and pay fees immediately eliminating the annoyance of following up by the committee. Once entered into the database all information is easily accessible for Basketball WA for reporting purposes.

As an added bonus, the junior players received a free basketball to which they could take home and practise their newly learnt drills. Every Tuesday a canteen is set up to take the stress out of cooking for exhausted parents, children and volunteers as well as providing a reliable source of fundraising for the Country Week teams.
