## Healthy Club Make-Over program

The Active Ashburton team launches its Healthy Club Make-Over program with a series of free workshops in October. Our mission is to enable stronger, connected clubs and communities by providing information and training to help volunteers become more successful.

The workshops are being presented by Sports Community (a group of experienced sports administrators and business managers passionate about grass roots sports, who share our passionate belief that healthy local sports clubs play a vital role in building healthy communities).

Training topics on offer:

## 1 Club Fundraising Strategies (Beyond the sausage sizzle!) - Tom Price & Paraburdoo

This session aims at introducing attendees to the many strategies available to raise funds for their clubs. Objectives:

- Identify and understand what the different types of revenues are which are traditionally accessed by clubs
- Review the importance of communication and its role in achieving club objectives
- Understand how to maximise the funds your club generates from:
  - Sponsorship
  - Events
  - Grants
  - Memberships
  - Social events
  - Other activities
- Understand how to identify sponsorship assets within your club and how to present these as sponsorship opportunities for local businesses
- Understand who offers grants and how clubs can maximise their chances of successfully applying for them
- Introduce the components of running a major event and its logistical considerations
- Understand why professional clubs spend so much effort building membership and how their strategies can be applied to your club.

#### 2 Social media for sports clubs - Paraburdoo

After attending this session attendees will be able to create effective social media strategies that use the most appropriate social media tools to achieve club goals and objectives. Session objectives include:

Identification of goals for your club's social media campaign

- Understanding why engagement and creating a sense of belonging are so important to effective social media communication
- Understand the different social media tools and how to use them:
  - Email newsletter
  - Facebook
  - Twitter
  - Instagram
  - Youtube
  - Hoote suite
- Understand how to measure the effectiveness of a social media campaign

## 3 Creating a great club culture and participation strategies which work - Tom Price

After attending this session attendees will learn about the power of a positive club culture, how to achieve it and how to use it to increase participation at their club. This session also looks at the many different strategies clubs can use to attract and retain participants:

- Understanding the importance of creating a positive club culture.
- Develop a clear understanding how to build and maintain a positive club culture
- Understand the effects of a poor culture
- Identify the different policies and procedures a club may have to support club culture
- Learn how policies enable unsatisfactory behavior to be dealt with more easily

These workshops are being held in Tom Price and Parburdoo. They are free to attend but bookings are essential - the first ten people to register in each town will receive a free Healthy Club Makeover prize bag.







KidSport enables Western Australian children to participate in community sport and recreation, no matter their financial circumstances. Eligible youth aged 5-18 years can apply for financial assistance to contribute towards club fees. Applicants must have a Health Care card or Pension Concession Card OR be referred by a recognised referral agent. A maximum of \$200 per child is available per calendar year.

The questions within the ASC Club Health Checklist focus on the key areas that drive clubs; how clubs set - and reach - targets considered important to running a successful club. The report provided at the completion of the survey gives clubs a clear picture of whether their operations and activities are on target to achieve their goals. # Pannawonica Youth and Recreation Development Officer appointed

Following community consultations and a survey of residents, the Shire of Ashburton has appointed Katie Taylor as Youth and Recreation Development Officer for Pannawonica. This newly created role is part of the Shire's partnership with Rio Tinto that aims to increase and sustain the liveability of Pannawonica by ensuring a vibrant, healthy and active community that is attractive to live, work and play. Concern about lack of youth activities was identified in the Shire's 10 year Community Strategic Plan and the appointment of Katie will help to address this gap. A series of "comeand-try" after-school activities is planned for term four, with additionally a weekly craft workshop to be held at the library. Katie's role will be to also increase the

town's involvement in regional tours by sporting associations; Pannawonica residents are invited to attend the upcoming BHP Biliton Aquatic Super series to be held in Karratha on Saturday 7 February 2015.

## Sports Medicine Australia

Sports Medicine Australia visited Paraburdoo on Friday 29 August to deliver their Club Injury Management Course. While the Course was targeting sporting clubs in town, an invitation was extended to the whole community; fifteen people attended including School teachers, netball, swimming and football club officials.

The three hour course provided participants with an in depth look at injury prevention, management, transport, concussion and preventative sports taping, participants to took turns to strap each other knees & ankles applying the techniques they had been shown.

Thank you to Paraburdoo FIFO worker & Sports Med WA trainer Will Armstrong for presenting the workshop and providing our volunteers with the knowledge to provide a safe environment for people engaging in sports in our community.



### Grant

#### Shire of Ashburton Grants

The Shire of Ashburton has funds available to groups that reside or operate within the Shire of Ashburton, OR are able to show a direct and substantial benefit to residents within the Shire of Ashburton

There are two areas of assistance available:

**Small Assistance Donations** - maximum \$500 per organisation/individual per financial year

**Community Support Grants** - maximum \$2,500 per organisation per financial year

Submission dates: March 1st

(projects Apr - Aug)

August 1st

(projects Sep - Mar).
This funding is only available to incorporated community and sporting organisations

Decisions to allocate funding to a project are based on the following criteria:

- The extent to which the project directly benefits the residents of the Shire of Ashburton
- Funding and/or contributions from other sources
- Value for money

Amount available: Individuals \$500

Closing date: 31 October 2014

Eligible groups: Applicants 12 - 18 years of

age (inclusive)

- Participating as an athlete, coach, umpire or referee in an official state or national championship; endorsed by the relevant Australian Sports Commission (ASC) recognised national sporting organisation (NSO)
- Applications must be completed and submitted prior to the championship commencing
- Applicants must travel greater than 250kms return to participate in the championship
- Applicants must be an Australian citizen
- Applicants MUST NOT have received a local Sporting champions grant for an event during the current financial year
- Applicants must not have received funding from another funding program administered by the ASC for the nominated championship
- The championship must not involve prize money

Amanda Green (current player, president, and full-time mum of three) forms the backbone of the Paraburdoo Netball Association. In addition, Amanda holds an active role on the Paraburdoo Primary School Parents and Citizens (P&C) board as treasurer. Amanda has been the driving force behind the net-set-go program, Paraburdoo netball umpiring squad, women's competition and mixed competition throughout 2012-2014. She is a results driven, passionate, professional, energized and committed leader.

In August 2013, Amanda facilitated the return of a mixed competition in response to a community need, which addressed a gap in the provision of local sport for the unisex population over the summer months. In February 2014, Amanda rallied for the provision of junior netball rings. This has enhanced and enabled the



net-set-go program. In March 2014 Amanda prompted the establishment of an umpire development squad in response to an identified gap of low confidence and competence in Paraburdoo Netball Association umpires. Thanks to her efforts, passion, and dedication of her voluntary work, she has encouraged broad community participation in sport/ recreation activities, and ensured netball (a vital part of the social fabric of small communities) continues in Paraburdoo.

## Line marking machines

## Mountain View Sporting Club AGM

Dates have been set for the 2014 AGM.

A minimum 20% of membership numbers are required to hold the first attempt at an AGM, 15% for the 2nd attempt and 10% for the 3rd and final attempt in order for the club to continue.

With increased memberships this year, more people are required to be present than last year.

The first meeting will be held on 2nd of November starting at 12.00pm, requiring 146 members (20%).

If required, the second meeting will be held on 9th of November starting at 12.00pm, requiring 110 members (15%).

If required, the third and **final** meeting attempt will be held on 16th of November starting at 12.00pm, requiring 73 members (10%).

There will be several committee positions open this year, most with a 2 year tenure.

- Treasurer (2 year term)
- Secretary (1 year term)
- 3 general committee members (2 year term)

## Paraburdoo Junior Cricket Club

Paraburdoo Junior Cricket Club are launching the Milo In2Cricket program in Paraburdoo on October 17 at the Paraburdoo Oval. The entry level participation program is for five to eight year olds and involves fun, safe activities that teach kids the basic skills to play cricket, in a supportive, non-competitive environment. The program costs \$65 per participant; who will each receive a pack containing a backpack, MILO, Aussie Cricket Crew membership, bat, hat, shirt, ball and other giveaways so kids can practice their skills during the program and at home with family and friends.

Members have an opportunity to become recreational members and build fitness, or to swim competitively and compete against other Pilbara and country teams. They are a family friendly club who warmly welcome new members. This season, club nights will be held on Thursdays at 5pm. Members have an opportunity to attend and participate in time trials before enjoying a meal with parents, coaches and fellow team mates in a relaxed and friendly environment.

The swimming club is fortunate to have four qualified coaches this season lead by newly appointed Head coach, Ray Whitfield. Ray has over 20 years experience as a professional swim coach, and comes with a wealth of knowledge and enthusiasm. Ray's passion for the sport and his personal drive will see all children developing their skills, while still having fun. The swim club is developing a stroke coaching clinic that will assist club members to swim at an elite championship level within the next 12 months.

The committee have been busy behind the scenes with pre-season preparations to ensure another successful and enjoyable season. The pool kiosk has been leased to the swim club who will be offering a range of drinks and foods to all pool users. They are looking forward

to seeing all club swimmers, both new and returning members succeed this year, whether it's beating their personal bests or beating other Pilbara clubs!

The club has 70 swimmers and 45 social members registered already. High School students are encouraged to join this dynamic club and keep fit through the summer.

Registrations are now open for the 2014/2015 season.

#### **Training Days**

Recreational swimmers swim twice a week on Tuesdays and Fridays afternoons.

Competitive swimmers train four times a week on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons and Saturday mornings.

The season runs from 1 October to 30 April and for the first time

the club will train through the school holidays to offer children an opportunity to keep their fitness up for the entire season.

All members are encouraged to attend Club Time Trial Nights on Thursday evenings from 5pm.

#### Information for New Members to the Club

New members joining TPASC will need to pass the following competencies:

- Confidently swim 25 metres Freestyle.
- Swim Breastroke kick technically correct and correct timing.

Fees: Recreational - \$260 for the season (3 sessions per week)

> Competitive - \$360 for the season (5 sessions per week)

Social Membership - \$5.00

Entry to the pool is not included in the clu bfees, however the Shire of Ashburton kindly offer club members a 20% discount on annual season passes.
