Community Sporting Club Equipment Subsidy

The second and final round for this year of the Community Sporting Club Equipment Subsidy (CSCES) scheme opens on 16 September 2014 (closing 17 October 2014). This scheme provides funding to community sporting clubs for the purchase of shared sporting equipment for training and competition purposes. A one off subsidy of \$500 will be made available to eligible clubs. The Western Australian State Government recognises the valuable role that sporting clubs play in communities across the state. It is also recognised that resources at sporting clubs are under pressure, with population growth increasing demand for equipment as well as the cost to supply the required equipment each year. This subsidy will assist clubs to provide the equipment they need to keep pace with growing demand.

Clubs must be incorporated, not-for-profit entities with an ABN and participate in, or conduct fixture community based sporting competitions. The subsidy must be used to purchase shared sporting equipment that is accessible to all club members for training or competition purchases. Applications must be submitted using the online application form available on the DSR website, www.dsr. wa.gov.au. Enquiries can be made by email equipmentsubsidy@dsr.wa.gov.au

Athlete Travel Subsidy Scheme

The Athlete Travel Subsidy Scheme (ATSS) supports talented athletes to pursue regional, state and national representation by providing a subsidy to assist with out of pocket travel and accommodation costs.

Small Grants For Small Rural Communities

Foundation for Rural and Funding Body: Regional Renewal (FRRR)

Eligible groups:

Not-for-profit community based organisations can apply for funds to support projects and activities that offer clear public benefit for communities in small rural, regional and remote locations in Australia, contributing to their social and community welfare, economic, environmental, health, education or cultural development.

- Applications from communities with a population of 10,000 or less will receive priority.
- To be eligible, projects must be for a charitable purpose (address a need in the community). The majority of funds are unrestricted but, some grants may be restricted to specific geographic locations.
- Organisations must have an ABN or Incorporation Certificate.
- Organisations demonstrating community partnerships will be preferred to multiple applications from one community.
- Projects being undertaken from January 2015 to January 2016 (projects will not be retrospectively funded).

Paraburdoo Amateur Swimming Club (PASC)

PASC is not only dedicated to helping budding young swimmers achieve their very best in the world of competitive swimming, but also to providing recreational swimmers with an opportunity to exercise and learn better swimming techniques in a fun environment.

The club provides opportunities for the more competitive swimmers to travel across the state as a team with their coaches, to compete at various swim meets throughout the season. These meets are always lots of fun, and great for team bonding in a sport that is a largely individual pursuit. Swim meets usually also involve team relays, march pasts (which involves the whole team dressing in costume competing for the best presented), poolside dancing competitions and parent/adult races.

Last season PASC had roughly 35 members, this season they hope to expand upon this number with the arrival of several new coaches. They have been lucky enough to find new parents who are keen to go away and learn how to become a coach/swimming instructor, which is fantastic. With more coaches on board they hope to increase the number of squads, and introduce



an adult squad for the first time, as well as the reintroduction of learn to swim classes for children aged 6 and up.

This season they would like to promote older children in the club, if you are at Tom Price Senior High School, They would love for you to join them after school a couple of times a week.

PASC is a fun loving and dedicated club that warmly welcomes all new swimmers, with an expectation that all parents become involved with volunteering their time for fundraising events, time keeping, assisting coaches, and being there for their children.
