Guest speaker and local Tom Price resident, Matt Carey provided a first-hand account of living with a disability. Around 50 participants enjoyed free pizza, popcorn, fruit and snacks. The event was made possible through funding from a successful Disability Awareness Week Grant application.

Young and old celebrated together on Friday 13 November to express gratitude to seniors for their contribution to the Tom Price community. The Tom Price Youth Centre provided a positive environment to encourage intergenerational contact. Participants enjoyed an afternoon tea with conversations, mural painting and a pool competition. Five elders from the Wakathuni community attended, along with members of the Nintirri Centre's Gold Group. The youth were respectful and enjoyed listening the stories. The collaborative mural artwork demonstrated what it means to 'connect all ages'.

The co-operation between Rio Tinto, the Shire of Ashburton, Tom Price Youth Support Association, Nintirri, East Pilbara Independent Support (EPIS) and IBN ensured the 2015 Seniors Week event was a successful and rewarding event. Funding for the event was provided through a grant from the Department of Local Government and Communities.

Tom Price Skill Xchange



Ciara King from Inclusion WA visited Tom Price from 3 - 5 December to help promote the Skill Xchange program. This innovative program links the Tom Price community by encouraging people to swap an hour of their time for an hour of another's. Sign up by contacting tpskillxchange@outlook.com and you will receive a registration form and a list of the skills on offer. Successful exchanges that took place this month:

- One participant provided an hour of make-up application and received a one hour credit to be used at any time.
- One participant provided one hour of dog training in return for one hour of document editing

The program is free to join and open to anyone over the age of 18 years. All skills are treated as equal. What this means is that skills are measured in hourly increments, making it easy to keep track of contributions and it places equal value on all community members.





KidSport enables Western Australian children to participate in community sport and recreation by providing financial assistance to eligible youth aged 5 to 18 years. Applicants who have a Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card, or are referred by a recognised agent, can apply for a voucher to cover the cost of fees to join a KidSport registered club in their local government area. A maximum of \$200 is available per child per calendar year.

Pink Ribbon Dinner

The spirit of the community was alive when over 60 ladies came together to raise funds for the Cancer Council at the inaugural Paraburdoo Pink Ribbon Dinner. Over \$3500 was raised for cancer prevention and research programs and patient support initiatives. Three local women coordinated the Pink Ribbon event to increase funding and awareness of women's cancers; supporting an estimated 18,715 women who will be diagnosed with breast or a gynaecological cancer this year.

"We have friends or family who are battling or who have battled cancer recently, so we wanted to do something about it. To show them we are right by their side and that there is hope" the ladies said.

"Every day in Australia, around 50 women are



diagnosed. One in 8 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer by the age of 85. It's a frightening statistic, but one that can change through the efforts of community and business groups". Over \$1000 was raised by the Paraburdoo Arts and Craft Group, through the sale of raffle tickets and a bake sale. The Paraburdoo Riders Association and Paraburdoo Inn each donated \$500 to the cause.

Indigenous Workshop

Pannawonica was privileged to welcome Baldja Moort, an indigenous boy's dance group from Hampton Senior High School, on 27 - 28 October. Baldja Moort visited the Pannawonica Primary School to perform a variety of traditional dances before inviting the children and staff to perform with them. Question time offered a great opportunity for the children to ask questions about dance, culture, experience, education and tradition.

Pannawonica's Community Hall was transformed into a seated lunch venue offering a variety of food including kangaroo stew and freshly baked damper. Following

positive feedback from both performers and community, the Pharli Pooni group have invited Baldja Moort to perform at next year's NAIDOC celebrations.



Strategies for Success Workshop

The Shire of Ashburton, in partnership with Rio Tinto, hosted a workshop for local clubs and groups on 12 November.

Popular consultant Shontay Cardew returned to Pannawonica to present participants with strategies for running a successful non for profit organisation. The session was well attended with representatives from five different clubs, including two attendees who made the long drive from Onslow.

The morning group session was followed by individual sessions to allow each club to discuss specific issues. All participants reported that they gained new information and confidence that will benefit their clubs.

Jim and Dot Salmon

Our December/January winners of the Volunteer of the Month award are Jim and Dot Salmon of Tom Price. Congratulations Jim and Dot - they each receive a certificate and a \$25 gift voucher.

Jim and Dot Salmon need little introduction to the Tom Price community. Most people in Tom Price have Jim's or Dot's mobile number on their speed dial. They have provided a free service to the community as reptile removers for the past 13 years. They catch and release approximately 200 reptiles in a year including many venomous snakes from mine sites, local businesses, schools, private homes and the hospital. They work entirely voluntarily and do not charge for their service despite being available 24 hours, seven days a week. Jim and Dot have produced magnets and books to help educate the public on what to do if they see a snake.

They have also trained other community members to identify and handle snakes. They are very worthy recipients of this month's Active Ashburton Award.
