KidSport

KidSport enables Western Australian children to participate in community sport and recreation by providing financial assistance to eligible youth aged 5 to 18 years. Applicants who have a Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card, or are referred by a recognised agent, can apply for a voucher to cover the cost of fees to join a KidSport registered club in their local government area. A maximum of \$200 is available per child per calendar year.

End of Financial Year Grant Acquittal

Acquitting a grant means accurately reporting on the funded activities and the expenditure of the funding. Grant reports and financial information are required on completion of your project.

Acquittal is a formal condition of funding. If a club does not provide a satisfactory grant report at the times and manner detailed in the funding agreement, the funding body will not make any further payments and the club may be ineligible to apply for further grants. The funding body may ask you to pay back all or part of the funding provided to you. It may take action to recover any unspent or misspent funding as a debt due and payable.

Be sure to read the funding agreement to check details of the grant acquittal material your club should be providing.

The grant acquittal report is where you advise:

- how the grant was spent
- what the outcomes of the funded activity were Note that if a grant acquittal report is not submitted or is deemed unsatisfactory, you may not be eligible to apply for further funding or receive further payments.

Tom Price Motor Cycle Club

On Sunday 31 May, the Tom Price Motorcycle Club held the second round of the local Interclub race between Tom Price and Paraburdoo. Despite unpredictable rainy weather, the amazing committee of volunteers rallied together in two days to have the track safe and race ready. A total of 21 riders competed on the day; 14 junior riders aged four to fifteen, seven senior riders, and a dedicated rider from Newman making the trip across. Each class had four races with a junior and senior feature race at the end. The next local round is scheduled for 19 July.

Panther's teenager, Mitchell Jones, impressed by winning plenty of the ball through the midfield and making some incredible tackles to keep the Gascoyne players under real pressure. Jayden Bennell and Blake Scott, both from Townsite Eagles held the defence together. Both players took plenty of intercept marks and used the ball well.

While the FNFL went down in this game, the future looks bright for the league as they had five players under the age of 18 who all contributed solidly throughout the match. The experience will stand them and the league in good stead for future representative games.

Club Profile

Paraburdoo Women's Softball Association

About the club:

Women's Softball has been played in Paraburdoo for over 40 years. The Paraburdoo Women's Softball Association (PWSA) was first established in the early 1970's when Paraburdoo was a thriving new community.
