# International Women's Day 2015

All around the world, International Women's Day represents an opportunity to celebrate the achievements of women while calling for greater equality. Make it Happen is the 2015 theme for International Women's Day; encouraging effective action for advancing and recognising women.

Each year International Women's Day is celebrated on March 8. The first International Women's Day was held in 1911. Thousands of events now occur each year to mark the economic, political and social achievements of women.

A special International Women's Day morning tea hosted by Nintirri Centre will take place on 4 March, while in Paraburdoo a sold-out dinner hosted by Karingal Centre will take place on 7 March.

### Inclusion WA

Ciara King from Inclusion WA returned to the Shire to oversee the first Steering Group meetings in Tom Price and Paraburdoo. Inclusion WA is working alongside the Shire to deliver the benefits of inclusion through the upcoming Have a Go Days. A steering group was formed in each town to help direct the program and ensure it meets community needs.

Formal training is also offered to clubs and groups who participate in the Inclusive program. The training focuses on how to welcome and accommodate those that are marginalised or have a disability so that they may participate in the club even if it isn't by playing the sport. Being an inclusive club can give groups and clubs greater access to funding, expand their volunteer base and improve club culture.



### Catch Music

Catch Music is a not for profit community organisation that creates spaces for people to get together and play music. Regular sessions are currently run across Perth. These inclusive music sessions are for people of all ages and ability, brought together by their passion for music. Working with the Shire's Club and Capacity Development team, Catch Music would like to establish in Tom Price and Paraburdoo.

Ninety minute sessions are run weekly during school term. A trained music facilitator leads the sessions with music selection decided by the group. More experienced musicians can mentor beginners. Songs are learnt and the group can work towards community performances.

Program director, Jason Bird visited Tom Price and Paraburdoo on 9-10 February and is excited about taking the Catch Music program regionally. Jason Bird became a household name when he was selected from thousands of other hopefuls to become part of Popstars' Scandal'us. The group went on to have international success and receive multiple accolades and awards including the 2001 ARIA award for Highest Selling Australian Single.

Jason has solidified his position in Australian performing arts. As a dancer and choreographer, his career spans almost two decades and boasts collaborations with some of Australia's most successful recording artists. Jason also featured as a resident choreographer in Network Ten's "So You Think You Can Dance Australia". Between television shows, award winning stage musicals and the recording studio, Jason also shares his love of the arts with his passion for community. Through his career he has continued to 'give back': as an ambassador for Youth Off The Streets, a mentor for underprivileged youth with U.S. based Dance Intensity Extreme, working with the Kimberley Region's indigenous youth with Ausdance WA's YouTube Me Dance program, and heading up Camp Quality's performance and education program for children living with cancer in WA.

Jason's experience and focus on making a meaningful difference in the community has seen him step into the role of Program Coordinator for Catch Music Inc. The program provides communities in the Perth Metropolitan area with nine weekly music sessions designed to bring people of all walks of life together, with a focus on those who are marginalised, through the magic of music.

Jason spent the whole day and evening talking to individuals and community groups about starting Catch Music jam sessions here in the Shire of Ashburton. The response from the community was incredible and Jason can't wait to start the jam sessions with some very keen musicians. No matter what your background or age is, if you love to play music then get in contact with the Active Ashburton team to register your interest.

Sport is not a luxury. It should be a fun part of every child's day and is a vital part of a well-rounded and long, healthy life. Active children are more likely to mature into physically-active adults and participation gives your child a better chance of doing well at school, improves coordination and balance, helps them sleep better, improves social and life skills and creates a greater sense of wellbeing.

KidSport is a partnership between the Department of Sport and Recreation and local governments. It's a voucher scheme which gives eligible youth aged 5-18 years up to \$200 a year per child towards club fees. So far, more than 36,000 Western Australians are KidSport kids!

# \$500.00 Club Equipment Subsidy

Do you need new club equipment?

The Department of Sport and Recreation's Community Sporting Club Equipment Subsidy (CSCES) provides funding to community sporting clubs for the purchase of shared sporting equipment for training and competition purposes. A one off subsidy of \$500 is available to eligible clubs. The next round opens 17 March and closes 17 April 2015.

Applications must be submitted using the online application form available via the DSR website, www.dsr.wa.gov.au . Applicants should read the guidelines before commencing application and complete all sections of the form.

### Clubs and Grants

Grants are a double edge sword for clubs. Many clubs successfully generate huge amounts of funds through grants while others spend many hours writing unsuccessful grant applications. So what are the secrets to writing a successful grant?

- Build a relationship with the funder, prior to commencing the application give the funder a call and talk about your project and their objectives. They will quickly tell you if they are a potential funder while giving you an opportunity to "sell" your club.
- Get support for your application from the broader community. Letters of support from influential people within your community will greatly enhance your chances of being successful even if they are not required by the funder.
- Clearly define and understand what your club will use the funding for.
- Clearly define the problem or program that requires the funding and the solution the funding will provide
- Keep your application as short and concise as possible

- Be creative, you need to capture the attention of the reader, remember they may be reading hundreds of applications
- Make sure you answer all the questions in the grant application and provide all supporting information requested, such as financial statements, quotes or plans.

# Cheaperthanhotels Jundraising program



## Tom Price BMX Club
