People use Tulypurpo or Emeibush to 'Smoke' mothers and babies to make the baby strong and help with the mother's breast milk.

People crush the leaves to make a wash for sore eyes, skin problems and headaches.

Tulypurpa grows near creek and in scrub country.

## 6. 'SOAKAGE / GUPI' Joanne Nangala, Tom Price

Gupi means 'water'; this artwork represents the spring and the water it gives, which is very important.

## 3. 'ROUND ROBIN' Pannawonica Craft Club, Pannawonica

Painting done by members of Pannawonica Craft Club. They had 5 minutes before passing the canvas to the next person, each only had the primary colours as well as black and white and had to mix up their own colours.

There's a love story here, but this is a fruit that grows on vines throughout certain times of the year.

When we practice lore we bring our young men back into our community, and during initiation time we have to paint up in red ochre. This brand is painted either on our backs or on our chest. We sit in the yard near the snakewood, we make a ring, and all the men sit in there. All the women and children are 50 metres away, and we sing all night. At midnight we all have to be in the ring, all of the sudden the old people start waving their boomerangs up in the heavens, and they start singing our lore.
