

#### What is the Census?



The **Census** is a count of all people and homes in Australia.

The Census counts every:



person



• household.



Your household includes everyone staying in your home on Census night.



The Census happens every 5 years.





The next Census is on **Tuesday 10 August 2021**.

The Census will ask questions about:



your age



• where you were born



• how many people you live with



• what languages you speak at home



what you do for work.



# Why we do the Census



The Census helps us understand how Australia changes.

It can also help governments and businesses plan for services such as:



schools



hospitals



transport



support for your community.



# Who needs to take part in the Census



Everyone in Australia must take part in the Census.



Your answers must be about where you are on Census night.



This might be different to where you usually live.



# **How to take part in the Census**



There are 2 ways to take part in the Census.

You can fill out the Census:



online



• on a paper form.




#### Online



To fill out your Census online, we will send you a letter.

Your letter will include a:



• Census number



password.



When you have your number and password, you can log in and fill out the Census on our website.




## On paper



If you get a letter and don't want to fill out your

Census online, you can ask us to send you a paper form.



You need to fill out the form and send it back to us after the Census.



We will give you an envelope to use.



Some people will get a visit from Census field staff in some areas.




#### This includes people who:



• live in remote areas



• are homeless.



People who are homeless don't have a home.

They must find a place to sleep each night.



#### Our field staff:

- wear an official Census badge
- carry a bright yellow bag.



Some of our staff who work with certain groups may choose not to carry their yellow bag.



For example, staff who work with people who are homeless.



# Your personal information



Your personal information is protected by law.



This means we must keep your personal information:

- safe
- private.



Private means that we will not share your personal information with anyone.




No one will know that your answers to the questions in the Census are about you.


